






Bringing Down the Duke

by Weina Dai Randel


Mei, a palace concubine, finds herself torn between the emperor and his son in this novel of courtly romance and intrigue in ancient China.

When Rhine Fontaine, a white-passing man in the Old West, rescues the beautiful and defiant Eddy Carmichael, one passionate night threatens their future plans.





Abbott Elementary has been garnering many well-deserved nominations since the show started airing. This year is no different with recognition from the Golden Globes and the Critics Choice Awards.




<u>Yellowjackets</u>





by Melissa Mollen Dupuis



by Abdi Nazemian



by Angeline Boulley




The Museum of Failures




