



reducing food waste at the grocery store.



by Kate Beaton



by Genevieve Cogman



The Burning Pages


by Paige Shelton


Stateless

The Peach Rebellion


by Wendelin Van Draanen

This Light Between Us


by Andrew Xia Fukuda

We Are Not Free


by Traci Chee

Daughters of a Dead Empire



by Laurie Forest



by Kerri Maniscalco



The town of Blithe Hollow has been cursed by a witch for centuries, and it's up to ghost-friendly Norman to save the day.




Monster House

The classic children's cartoon follows the Peanuts gang as they head out to a costume party, go trick-or-treating, and await the Great Pumpkin.




Casper

Brothers Wirt and Greg find themselves lost in a strange autumnal land. This gorgeously animated TV series runs the length of a movie.








Froggy Goes to the Library

by Adam Lehrhaupt


Placed on a less prominent library shelf, Book starts feeling lonely and neglected. Are all its exciting adventures over? A heartwarming story not to be missed.

by Ruby Shamir


Bunny decides to make grape jelly for her peanut butter sandwich. After several unsuccessful attempts to find the right recipe, she heads out to her local library for help.

by Elise Parsley


What will happen if you ever bring a circus to the library? Do you think it will be fun? Cute and entertaining, this book will make young readers laugh out loud.

by Viviane Elbee


Daryl gets upset when his mom drops his favorite dinosaur book in the return bin. Through engaging illustrations, this story celebrates the joy of sharing.

by Alison Donald


As the kids go in search of their missing librarian, they stumble upon a huge bear. Could he be their new librarian? A hilarious story with an unexpected turn of events.
